

II Timothy 2:15 School of Biblical Studies is an online bible college that offers Audio/Video Courses. All homework essays, guizzes and final exams will be completed/submitted online. Each course is 12 weeks (12 lessons) in total. Each lesson is opened for students on Mondays and the students need to complete the

lesson no later than Sunday Evening that same week. The next lesson is opened the next Monday. Week 13 is for students to complete their final exam, final paper/essay and course critique. After completion of all 36 Courses, the student can obtain a bachelor's degree in theological studies.

Course Description - 5TH Year

GC25 - CR #25: The Great Commission

(Semester Hours: 12)(4 Credit hours)

As a child of God, you are ordained by God to play a key roll in fulfilling God's central purpose on this earth: TO SEEK AND SAVETHAT WHICH WAS LOST! This course, is designed to help you to confidently and effectively spread the faith to family, co-workers, friends and neighbors. We will employ natural approaches that work over time with the goal of bringing those who have been placed into your life to the point of receiving Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Savior In this course you will learn how to communicate the Gospel message in your own personal God-given style.

TCF26 – CR#26: The Christian Family A Biblical Guideline

(Semester Hours: 12)(4 Credit hours)

In this course, we examine steps and guidelines enabling the understanding and establishment of a healthy family. The student will examine topics including: Relationships Begin With Honor, The Engagement, The Covenant and Honeymoon, The obligation to Stay married, Dishonor, Bitterness and a Closed Spirit Guidelines for Christian Parenting, How Mothers Should Build Their Homes, Raising Your Children In the Lord, Understanding Your Child's Bent, Shaping The Will To Prevent Rebellion and Dealing with the Rebellious Child.

SW27 CR #27: Spiritual Warfare

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

Many believers are suffering unnecessarily because they do not realize they are engaged in a war, a spiritual war. In this interactive course, we will examine what the Word of God provides us with in the area of Spiritual Warfare. NO Christian need suffer at the hands of the enemy! This course is based upon the teaching - Spiritual Warfare - Terms of Engagement by Dr. David Jeremiah, founder of Turning Point ministry with his permission, we have incorporated his teaching into our course. We will dig deeply into the fact that we are in a war and that God has given us protective armor - The Armor of God. Yet we will come to better understand the fact that it is up to us to clothe ourselves with it - first though faith in Christians as Savior and then in continual submission to Him as Lord. Only By living a life continually clothed with Christ will spiritual victory be ours!

FS28 CR #28: Financial Strategies: A Godly Perspective

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

This course is designed to inform the student of the biblical perspective of Financial Prosperity. This course will instruct the students on how to maintain financial stability while at the same time completing the call of God on their lives.

L0H29 Course #29: A Life Of Honor: Love, Marriage and Sex/ Single: Love it or Hate it / Divorce Recovery

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

Based upon the Song of Solomon, we examine what the Word of God says about Love, Marriage and Sex. We also examine the Single life – A guide to dating, waiting and choosing a mate.... or just maybe you are Single and loving it! How to live the Christian Single life!

And then, Divorce. What does the Bible say about divorce? Is there life after divorce? The only person that can keep you from moving forward is you!

ACL30 CR #30: A Christian Life style: Ethical and Moral Issues

(Semester Hours: 12)(4 Credit hours)

To understand the contrast between biblical morality and ethics and that of the world's system

Course Description - 6TH Year

LTP32 CR #32: Leadership Theory, Principles and Application

(Semester hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

Church leaders must understand their role is never to bring glory to themselves. Their role is to always point to Jesus Christ, the Living Word.

In this course we will examine Biblical Principles of leadership which are firmly establish in the greatest leadership book available to man - the Holy Bible.

LTP33 CR #33: Leadership Theory, Principles and Application 2

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

The objective of the course is to train those who have a heart to serve and those who desire knowledge and confidence to do so.

LTP34 CR #34: Leadership Theory, Principles and Application 3

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

The objective of the course, The New Testament Church, is two fold:

- 1. To better understand the Church that God planned and the Church that Jesus purchased with His Blood.
- 2. To identify this Spiritual Body in today's world

TCC35 CR #35: The Christian Counselor 1

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

The objective of this course is to help Christians develop a general approach to Christian Counseling through the understanding and application of Biblical Principles. Rather than pursuing the avenue of "worldly counsel" - one will obtain keys to an avenue of counsel that will not only yield positive restoration of people's immediate problems, but guidance in helping them deal with and solving future problems as well

TCC36 CR #36: The Christian Counselor 2

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

Continuation of CR#31 The Christian Counselor 1

LTP31 CR #31: The Realities of the Spiritual Dimension

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

In this Course you will take a journey beyond the visible and enter the portal of the invisible power of God. You will come to better know and understand how faith is the invisible key to entering into the Spiritual Dimension of God.

Course Description - 3rd Year

0TS13 Course #13: Old Testament Survey I

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

An in-depth study of the Old Testament including God and His Revelation, His Creation, The Patriarchs, the Exodus, the Law, the Land of Promise and the Beginning of the Monarchy

PNJ14 Course #14: Prayer And The Name Of Jesus

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

This course is designated two parts: First a study of Prayer and the magnitude of it in the student's life. Secondly, a study of Jesus' name and the power in the name of Jesus.

0TS15 Course #15: Old Testament Survey II

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours) (Semester Hours: 12 (4 Credit hours) A continued in-depth study of the Old Testament including the United and the Divorced Kingdoms, The Exile and Restoration, Wisdom, Major Prophets, and Minor Prophets.

R16 Course #16: Romans

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

A study of all the Apostle Paul had to say about our redemption, sanctification, and righteousness. How sin conscious thinking must go, and righteous mentality must begin in the believer.

DTF17 Course #17: Defending The Faith

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

In these latter days, one of Satan's primary strategies against the church is to undermine doctrine and spiritual truths of the Word Of God. Believers must discern Satan's strategy and must know, understand, and hold fast to sound doctrine and spiritual truths. this course is a study of growing in the grace and the knowledge of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Contending for and defending the faith.

H18 Course #18: Healing

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

A study in how God's desire for what healing was, is and ever shall be a part of the righteous believer

Course Description - 4th Year

UBM19 CR#19: Understanding Bible Mysteries in Types and Shadows

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

Why are some parts of the Bible difficult to understand? Why didn't God just say it simply? In this course, we examine difficult passages of Scripture and gain insight and understanding to prophetic mysteries hidden with parables, types, shadows, copies and stories in the Bible -unmasking hidden truths.

CIAH20 CR #20: Christianity in American History

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

In this course, students will become more aware of the true influence of Christianity on the founding of the United States, We will examine topics such as: Why History Matters, Christianity in the Discovering of America, Unearthing the American Christian Foundation, The Faith of the Founding Fathers, The Ideas that Birthed a Nation, The Church, The state and the REAL First Amendment, Faith in our Early Courts, How Pastors Shaped Our Independence and the Assault on Judeo-Christian Values.

HOF21 CR #21: Heroes of The Faith-VIDEO

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours) (Semester Hours: 12 (4 Credit hours) In this course, we will examine the lives and the voices of those who fought to reintroduce the beliefs and the principles of the early church as well as those who continued to maintain the mandate: Mark 16:15 "Go ye into all the world, and preach the Gospel to every creature," In this interactive video course, we will introduce you to 12 Heroes of the Faith: John Wycliffe, John Hus, Martin Luther, William Tyndale, Zwingli/Calvin, John Knox, John Bunyan, Charles Wesley, Charles Spurgeon, Oswald Chambers, Billy Sunday and Billy Graham.

SCC22 CR #22: Secrets to the 2nd Coming of Christ

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

In this course, we will unlock the prophetic truth to the second coming of Christ We will examine topics which include: The First Predictions of Humanity's Future, Biblical Evidences, Enoch's Vision, The Sign of Methuselah, Clues to the Coming of Christ, God sets the timing of Prophetic Events, The Time of Restoration, Ten Signs of the End of the World, The Generation That Will Not Pass Away, Explaining Historic Prophetic Passages, The four Cups of the Passover and the Past Sets the Pattern for the Future.

GG23 CR #23: God's Generals-VIDEO

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

In this interactive video course (Based upon the Video Series - God's Generals by Robert Liardon), we will examine the lives of 12 of the "God's Generals", We will study their calling, separation, Spiritual Training, Obedience to the Call, the Blessing and the Fruit of their Obedience to the Call as well as the areas where some of them fell short, These generals include: John Alexander Dowie, Maria Woodworth Etter Charles Parham, William Seymour Evan Roberts, John G, Lake, Smith Wigglesworth, Aimee Simple McPherson, Jack Coe, William Branham, A, A, Allen and Kathryn Kuhlman.

H18 Course #18: Healing

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

The course will inform the student of the future events regarding the Body of Christ and the role we will play in it. Topics include: Do You Believe There Is a Resurrection? How The Resurrected Body Works, What Can the Resurrected Body Do? We Must Be an Active Member of the Body of Christ, Contrasting Salvation and Rewards, The Judgment Seat Of Christ, He Will Judge the Secrets of Men, By What criteria Will the Lord Judge Us? Our Rewards, and it is all about Jesus!

Course Description - 1st Year

BC1 Course #1: Blood Covenant

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

The bible is composed of two covenants, contracts, or agreements. Theist covenant was between Abraham and Jehovah and was sealed by circumcision. The New Covenant is sealed with the Blood of Jesus Christ, God's own Son. This Course will contrast the two covenants; this course will also include a study in Hebrews and the present-day ministry of Christ.

BBB2 Course #2: Basic Bible Beliefs

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

This course is a study of Biblical doctrine, not religious doctrine, The course is designated chronologically to provide the student with important Biblical facts which will enable them to be better acquainted with God's eternal plan

NCR3 Course #3: New Creation Realities

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

This course will cover studies including: the Living word, Christian the Light of the Pauline Revelation: what the Resurrection gives us; The legal and vital aspects of Redemption; and the cultivating of the Human Spirit

D4 Course #4: Discipleship

(Semester hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

This course is designated to instruct the Christian in the proper conduct of a disciple and to enhance the spiritual growth of the individual, Enabling the disciple to progressively reach higher levels of maturity.

TWC5 Course #5: Thinking with The Mind Of Christ

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

This course will cover studies such as: The Mind of Christ, The Carnal Mind -vs-The Renewed Mind: Basic needs and how they are met; Developing relationships; Love, Acceptance and Forgiveness; Life without strife; Breaking Intimidation; and Finding Life-long happiness.

ICP6 Course #6: In Christ Principles

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

This course is designated to help us better understand our relationship in Christ, and how to operate in the natural world around us using Christ's principles.

Course Description - 2nd Year

NTS7 Course #7: New Testament Survey

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

An in-depth study of the World and the Nature of the New Testament. We will investigate the texts of the New Testament - identifying authors, exploring the contents, and practice principles of interpretation for the New Testament.

FWL8 Course #8: Faith is a Way Of Life

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

This course will cover the who, what, where why and how of Faith.

UTA9 Course #9: Understanding the Anointing

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

This course will cover studies of the General Work of the Holy Spirit the Nature of the Holy Spirit; The Ministry of the Holy Spirit in the Believer

MWF10 Course #10: Men and Women of Faith

(Semester hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

This course will show through examples of men and women, how faith changed the course of life for many individuals, including nations of people. One Christian with faith and God can change the world.

MCH11 Course #11: Modern Church History

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

Through the study of the scriptures and Church History, this course is designated to give the student a Biblical understanding and appreciation of the spiritual phenomenon we call revival. It will entail a study of what revival is, what revival is not, its features, helps, hindrances, as well as what the history of the church has taught us about the movement of God's Spirit We will also study and examine the lives of several men and women of God who God has used in past revivals to bring about.

E12 Course #12: Excellence

(Semester Hours: 12) (4 Credit hours)

This course deals with progressive sanctification and what it takes to develop the Christian to the point of excellence and how to help others achieve the same goal
